

Dear Residents,

We have been made aware of stories alleging a purported connection between an individual's historic health issue and the portion of the Silo Mills neighborhood which once served as a landfarm. We know that this may be a concern for many of you in the community and we want you to know that we share your concern. Nothing matters more than the health and safety of the families that call this neighborhood home.

To keep you informed, we wanted to share the following information, which is accurate and true.

During the time that a portion of the land that forms our community operated as a landfarm, it successfully followed and complied with very strict guidelines as set forth by the Texas Railroad Commission, with regular testing of the deposited materials. The Commission's permit for the property allowed non-hazardous, water-based drilling fluids and cuttings only, (nothing oil-based) and specifically did not allow this area to receive any radioactive materials. All of the records we have seen show that the guidelines were strictly followed and the testing showed nothing that could possibly account for the statements and accusations made in the recent stories.

Furthermore, the Phase I environmental site assessment conducted in 2020 also found no evidence of environmental hazards in connection with the property. A link to a copy of the report has been included for reference.

In addition, one of the stories which mentions testing near Pleasant View Elementary reports that the test for any radioactive material came back, "below the regulatory limit."

Finally, the Godley Independent School District contacted an environmental investigator from the county constable's office, who conducted a preliminary review and testing in the area, which once again indicated no safety concerns.

To date, we have seen no scientific or medical findings that establish any kind of link between the operation of the landfarm that comprises a portion of the neighborhood and any specific health issues.

We would like to stress that we've had people working at the site for over a decade, and there have been residents living there for years. In that time, we have never received any questions or concerns about health issues that might be related to anything hazardous in the neighborhood or seen evidence of any sort of environmental contamination.

We want to assure you that the board of directors and management team are taking these concerns very seriously. We are working to get to the bottom of these claims, which seem to be at odds with all of the underlying scientific facts and tests and will continue to share any new information we can as it becomes available.
